UCF Basic Requirements for Training

In the Protection of Human Subjects in Research

The following on-line tutorial is accepted by UCF and most other research institutions as providing the basic education needed to conduct human subjects research. This course must be completed by all key study personnel (KSP)** listed on the study before final IRB approval can be granted to begin a research study, to continue a research study by annual renewal or for protocol addendum/modifications.

CITI Course in the Protection of Human Research Subjects

The University of Central Florida participates in the Collaborative IRB Training Initiative (CITI) on-line program to provide educational courses for personnel involved in the conduct of human subjects research. The course curriculum has been defined by UCF to include different learner groups based on the specific area of research. For research to be conducted at UCF, the learner should select the modules that most closely represent the type of research to be conducted. For research involving surveys, questionnaires, etc., the Social & Behavioral modules should be completed. If the research involves the use of human tissue, blood, etc. and/or is 'clinical' in nature, then the researcher should complete the biomedical modules.

The principal investigator for each protocol is responsible for ensuring that he/she and all the KSP assigned to the research complete this course, which will fulfill the basic human subjects protection training requirement for UCF for a three-year period.

**** Key Study Personnel (KSP)** - Key study personnel include those who are involved in the design and/or conduct of the research, have access to human participants, and/or data information. This would include principal investigators, co-investigators (sub-investigators), research nurses, study coordinators, research associates/assistants, lab monitors, students and other support staff or persons assisting with the research.

Principal investigators of funded research may want to also check sponsor or grantor specific definitions for key study personnel requiring training to determine if other requirements (i.e., NIH) apply for human subject protection or responsible conduct of research training.

Additional training is required every 3 years. A CITI refresher course is available for future training for those who have completed CITI since 2005. If you have questions, please contact the IRB office at 407-823-2901.

Submission of CITI completion certificates taken at other universities are acceptable if the training was completed within the last three years.

Submission of an NIH Human Subjects Protection online training certificate may be acceptable if it is for NIH funding and the research is of a biomedical nature. The NIH on-line training is available at <http://phrp.nihtraining.com/users/login.php> .
