

Grant Seeking and Preparation Fundamentals

BACKGROUND:

Writing a grant proposal requires knowledge on finding funding opportunities, how to plan a proposal, components of a proposal, proposal evaluation criteria, budgeting, etc. Grant Seeking and Preparation Fundamentals is a self-guided webcourse, created by the Research Development Team in the UCF Office of Research, with the intention of providing a variety of primer information (videos and resources) on topics and tools related to grant seeking and preparation. Completing this webcourse will help you prepare your first grant proposal.

- Proposal Planning: Understanding Request for Proposal components, emphasizing adherence to guidelines, reaching out to program managers, tools for seeking collaborators, and strategies for managing large interdisciplinary research proposals effectively.
- Grant Writing Tips: Essential aspects of successful grant proposal writing, including the foundational elements, aligning proposals with funder priorities, and understanding the perspectives of reviewers.
- Budgeting Basics: Fundamentals of grant budgeting, focusing on direct and indirect costs, and aligning budget details with project needs.

Completing this course will help you find funding opportunities in your field and help prepare your first grant proposal.
