SUBRECIPIENT COMMITMENT FORM GUIDANCE

SECTION A: Organization Information

- Effective April 4, 2022, all organizations receiving Federal financial awards (i.e., grants, cooperative agreements, contracts) or **subawards** are required to have a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) created in SAM.gov. This includes both foreign and domestic organizations. **UCF will not issue a subaward to an entity until it applies for and receives a UEI.**
- If the subrecipient is owned or controlled by a parent entity, provide that information on the Subrecipient Commitment Form to do an overview risk analysis.

SECTION B: Certifications

- 1. Active System for Award Management (SAM) registration is a prerequisite to submit grant applications and receive funding from the Federal Government. SAM includes an organization's registration to do business with the government, their Representations & Certifications, and any exclusion records from Excluded Parties List System (EPLS), active or expired. This includes both foreign and domestic organizations.
- 2. Per 2 CFR §200.331(4) if the subrecipient has a federally negotiated indirect cost rate, that rate must be used. If the subrecipient does not have a negotiated rate, per 2 CFR §200.414(f) a de minimis rate of 15 percent of modified total direct costs may be included in the budget. If a sponsor limits the allowable indirect cost rate by either written policy or by program solicitation, UCF will flow down the reduced rate to all subrecipients. UCF will NOT negotiate an indirect cost rate with a subrecipient.
- **3.** Fringe Benefit rates should be confirmed by ORC as part of the budgeting process. Per 2 CFR §200.431 fringe benefits are allowable provided that the benefits are reasonable and are required by law, non-Federal entity employee agreement, or an established policy of the non-Federal entity. Any rates not federally negotiated should be reviewed for consistency.
- **4.** Small Business Concerns (SBC) must be identified in the event special terms are required to be flowed down by the Federal entity. If a subrecipient is identified as a small business concern, the type should be identified. This also assists UCF with SBC reporting. See the U.S. Small Business Administration for clarification.
- **5.** 2 CFR §200.302 and FAR 52.245-1 require an entity to "control, protect, preserve, and maintain all Government Property" in its possession or under its control. A government-approved property control system indicates an entity's compliance with OMB and FAR regulations, and is a factor for risk analysis if

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subrecipient will be purchasing equipment. If an organization does not have a government-approved property control system and are purchasing or receiving Government Furnished Property/Equipment, the organization is automatically considered high risk.

- 6. According to 22 CFR Part 120-130, all manufacturers, exporters, and brokers of defense articles, related technical data and defense services on the International Traffic in Arms (ITAR) United States Munitions List (USML) are required to register with the Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC). UCF cannot issue a subaward to an organization performing ITAR export-controlled work until the organization is registered with the DDTC.
- 7. Executive Orders 12549 and 12689, 2 CFR part 180 state that suspension and debarment actions prevent companies and individuals from participating in government contract, subcontracts, loans, grants and other assistance programs. Any organization or individual that is presently debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment is not eligible to receive Federal funds. Any person presently indicted or who has been convicted or, within the past three years, received a civil judgment against them for the reasons listed are not eligible to receive Federal funds. UCF cannot include such individuals and organizations in any subaward or procurement action.

If an organization or individual has had one or more contracts terminated for default by a Federal agency within the past three years, consult with your Assistant Director for further direction regarding the ability to issue a subaward.

SECTION C: Conflict of Interest

8. 42 CFR part 50.604(a) put in place Financial Conflict of Interest (FCOI) policies to preserve the public's trust that research supported by PHS agencies, and those agencies following PHS FCOI rules, is conducted without bias and with the highest scientific and ethical standards. Any entity proposing to a PHS agency, or any agency adopting PHS FCOI rule, must have a PHS-compliant FCOI policy in place or agree to abide by UCF's policy. A subaward cannot be issued if the organization does not have a policy or will not follow UCF's policy.

Standards have been created to promote objectivity in research and to provide a reasonable expectation that the design, conduct, and reporting of research will be free from bias resulting from conflicts of interest. A subrecipient must certify the existence of an active and enforced conflict of interest policy consistent with 42 CFR Part 50, Subpart F.

While not all program or funding announcements contains specific statements as to the applicability of the FCOI regulations, agencies do list their award management guidelines and/or standalone COI policies on their website. Prior to submitting a proposal, UCF recommends checking for relevant FCOI

requirements on the federal funding agency's website. **UCF will NOT issue a subaward to an entity** without sponsor mandated policy or that does not agree to follow UCF's policy.

SECTION D: Audit Status

9. Per 2 CFR 200.512 UCF is required to obtain audits and perform annual risk assessments on subrecipients. UCF may utilize the <u>Federal Audit Clearinghouse</u> or the <u>FDP Expanded Clearinghouse</u> to obtain audit information. If the subrecipient audit is not available UCF will request audit reports directly from the subrecipient. The threshold is for <u>any</u> Federal expenditure, not just research.

A subrecipient that does not have an audit prepared in accordance with 2 CFR 200 Subpart F <u>must</u> complete the Audit Certification and Financial Status Questionnaire. Refer to this document's guidance instructions.

SECTION E: Project Information

- **10.** A "human subject" can be a living individual who becomes a subject in research, an individual whose specimen is used in research, or an individual whose private and identifiable information is obtained. The subrecipient must submit to UCF their Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval prior to receiving a subaward from UCF. When human subject use does not occur at the beginning of the project, it is possible to issue a subaward with enough incremental funding to conduct the research until the animal use begins. Consult with your Assistant Director for guidance on issuing a subaward prior to IRB approval.
- **11.** The Federalwide Assurance (FWA) is the only type of assurance currently accepted and approved by the Office for Human Research Protections (OHRP). Through the FWA, an institution commits to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) that it will comply with the requirements in the HHS Protection of Human Subjects regulations at 45 CFR part 46. If the subrecipient does not have an FWA, it will need to rely on either UCF's IRB or an independent IRB for approval.
- **12.** Animal use includes both laboratory animals and wildlife animals. The subrecipient must submit to UCF an approval from their Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) prior to receiving a subaward from UCF. When animal use does not occur at the beginning of the project, it is possible to issue a subaward with enough incremental funding to conduct the research until the subject use begins. Consult with your Assistant Director for guidance on issuing a subaward prior to IACUC approval.
- **13.** Per 2 CFR 200.306 cost share is not expected by Federal agencies unless specified in a notice of funding opportunity. Therefore, Subrecipient cost share should be provided only when required by a sponsor's written policy or program solicitation. Once the cost share is proposed in UCF's budget, it becomes committed cost share and must be tracked by financial compliance. If the subrecipient does not meet their cost share commitment, UCF will be responsible for providing the difference to the sponsor. Increased monitoring of the subrecipient may be necessary.

- **14.** If a Confidential Disclosure Agreement is needed at the proposal stage, contact the <u>UCF Contract Office</u> for assistance.
- **15.** Institutions with U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) supported biomedical or behavioral research, research training or activities related to that research or research training must provide PHS with an assurance of compliance with the Public Health Service Policies on Research Misconduct, 42 C.F.R. Part 93. **UCF will not issue a subaward under a PHS sponsor if the organization does not have a RM Assurance Number.**
